

Shaping Our Future Together

Sunday June 9th from 3-5pm

As the Diocese of Edmonton embarks on a strategic planning process to thoughtfully consider our current state and position in the community and the broader world, we know that the strongest starting point is the parishes and the people who fill them. Each of your individual perspectives, experiences, and reflections hold great value as a part of our collective story.

This Parish Engagement Session, led by Anna Bubel of Another Way consulting, is an opportunity to look at the pieces of the story we have gathered thus far, from quantitative data to your individual responses to the Parishioner Survey, and more. During this 2h session, we will provide details around the Listening in Spirit project, including key milestones and deliverables; we will validate the findings to date, focusing on the strengths within each parish; and we will explore the opportunities facing each parish. We will provide a summary report of findings that includes various data collected, as well as an overview of the survey responses.

All attendees will have the opportunity to expand on the findings, ask questions, provide clarifications, and further build out the story of your parish and its place in the Diocese. You are the most important element of this conversation, and we are pleased and excited to hear from you.



Summary History of Bench and Tree

A REMINDER ABOUT THE OUTDOOR BENCH and THANK YOU TO BILL KESANKO FOR RECENT FRESHENING UP OF THE BENCH

The idea for an outdoor bench in the shady nook beside the office door of the church came about in the year 2005 at the time Rev. Jane Alexander was the incumbent. The family of Ivy Hagen and Allan Hagen offered to finance the bench in memory of Cathy Baptie, Ivy's daughter and Allan's sister.

It was hoped that the bench dedicated to "Come, Rest Awhile" would offer people walking by a place to rest as well as a space to place memorial plaques in memory of loved ones.

Spanning the years 2005 -2017 thirty-eight Memorial plaques have been placed on the bench until there was no more usable space remaining. Over the years the bench has been maintained by Bruce Hyde, Bev Orieux, and now Bill Kesanko who has just finished sanding and painting it.

In 2020 in order to facilitate another space to place memorials an indoor Memorial Tree was painted and placed on the wall of St. Monicca's chapel. To date there have been 53 memorial leaves placed on it with 3 leaves waiting to be placed when the families are ready.
